

FARMER LAWSUITS AGAINST SYNGENTA

Thousands of farmers who grew corn in 2013 and 2014 have been filing lawsuits against Syngenta. The lawsuits allege that Syngenta marketed a specific genetically modified corn seed, known as MIR162, despite knowing that China and many other international trading partners would refuse the genetically modified corn. The lawsuits go on to allege that due to China's rejecting imports of corn that even had traces of the MIR162 corn, the price of all corn decreased dramatically. This decrease in the price of corn in 2013 and 2014 cost farmers, elevators and others who sold corn, significant losses in income. Industry estimates have put the loss at \$.11 to \$1 per bushel.
